



Alumni Association Survey Results

Executive Summary

How the data were compiled:

The following data were compiled from 84 responses to the LV Alumni Association Survey that was taken in the Summer of 2011, with an eye toward guiding the direction and future of LV alumni initiatives.

The survey was publicized via e-mail to the 367 LV alumni for which we have e-mail addresses, and then a follow-up plug was sent out via standard mail to all LV alumni who had made a donation to the 2011 Alumni Matching Grant when they received their Br. Ed's Club gifts. The response represents a 22.9% response rate from those who were e-mailed the survey.

The total number of alumni in our eTapestry database is 491. This means we are lacking e-mail addresses for 124 LV alumni (25.2%), and that unless they happened to receive a Br. Ed's Club gift, they were likely unaware that the survey was taking place.

Salient observations and questions stemming from the survey:

1. LV alumni from 2000 through present responded in greater numbers than alums from before 2000
 - Should we target LV alumni from certain time periods?
 - How can we obtain contact information for LV alumni who we have not been able to reach?
2. Of the core values, service and community seem to have the greatest importance in the lives of LV alumni today and faith, in comparison, seems to have slightly lesser importance in the lives of LV alumni today.
 - How does this inform our activities / emphasis for engaging LV alumni?
 - How does this inform our formation and support for current LVs?
3. Over 50% of alums surveyed are in contact with other LV alumni at least monthly
 - How do we foster and leverage the strong personal relationships formed by LVs?
4. Nearly 40% of alums surveyed have no contact with current LVs; over 40% of alums surveyed would like more frequent contact with current LVs.
 - What avenue(s) can be created / strengthened to provide LV alumni and current LVs more contact with one another?
5. Feelings about the LVAA were nearly all positive. Almost 70% of alums surveyed would like more frequent contact with other LV alumni from their service year; after that, alums surveyed would like more frequent contact with Brothers from their ministry / community (50%) – followed by LV alumni from their ministry / community (45%) and current LVs (43%).
 - What activities can we promote to build on this enthusiasm, and provide LV alumni more contact with these groups?
 - How can we ensure to follow-through on these activities?
6. Local activities, such as welcome nights for new LVs, trivia nights and happy hours, and retreats, generated more interest on the survey than national activities.
 - How can we support and empower alums to lead events locally?
 - In which districts / cities has this interest been expressed most strongly?
 - How can we attend to LV alumni who are in cities where there is less of a Lasallian presence?

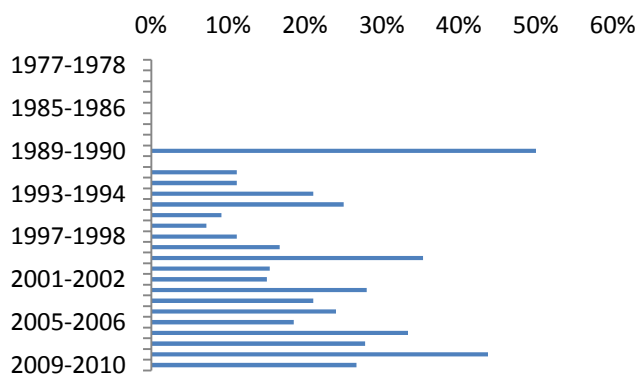

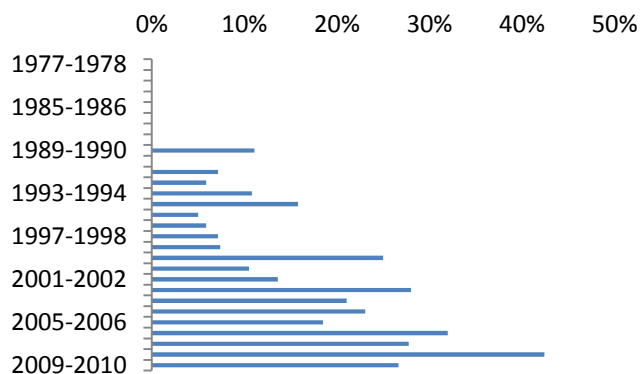

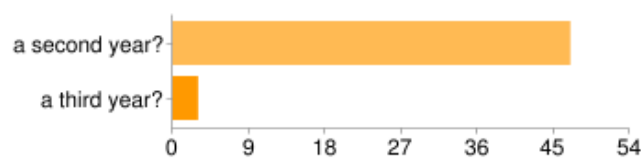
Response rates by LV cohort

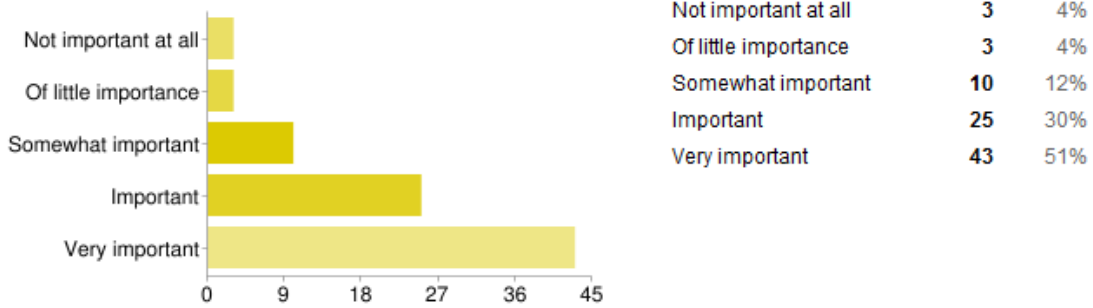

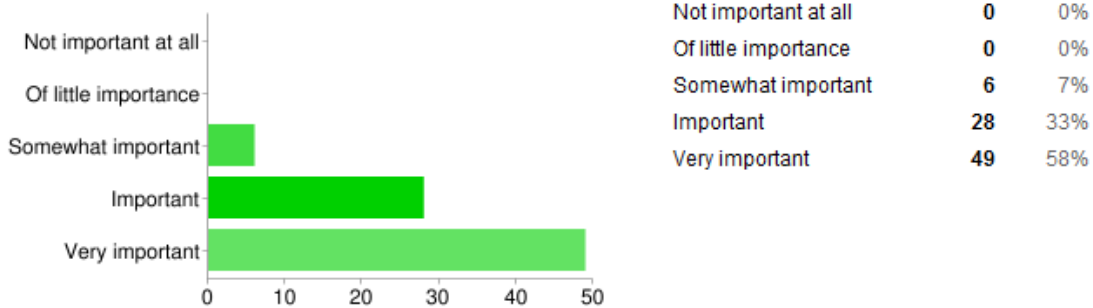

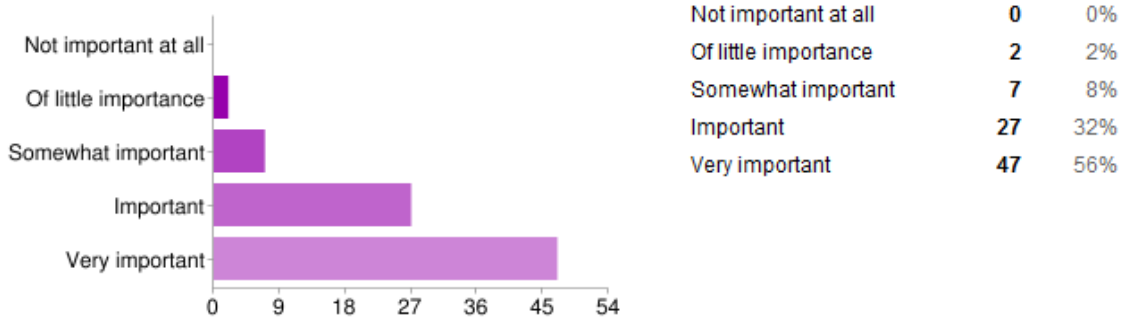
The LV program emphasizes the core values of faith, service, and community. Please indicate how important each one is in your life today. - Faith



The LV program emphasizes the core values of faith, service, and community. Please indicate how important each one is in your life today. - Service

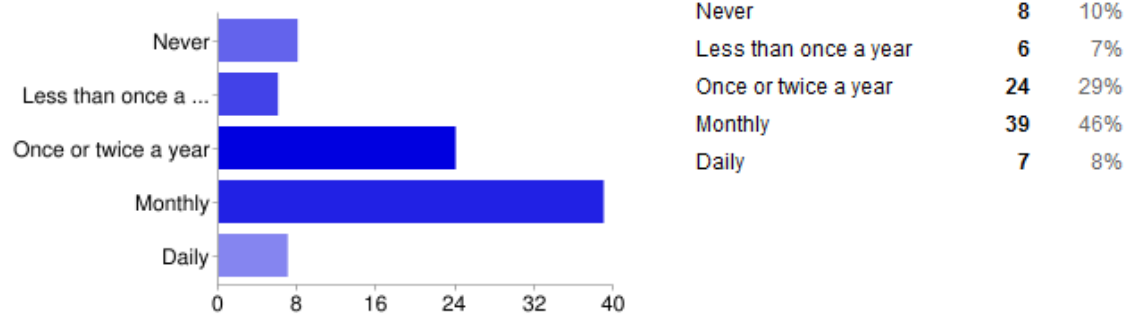


The LV program emphasizes the core values of faith, service, and community. Please indicate how important each one is in your life today. - Community

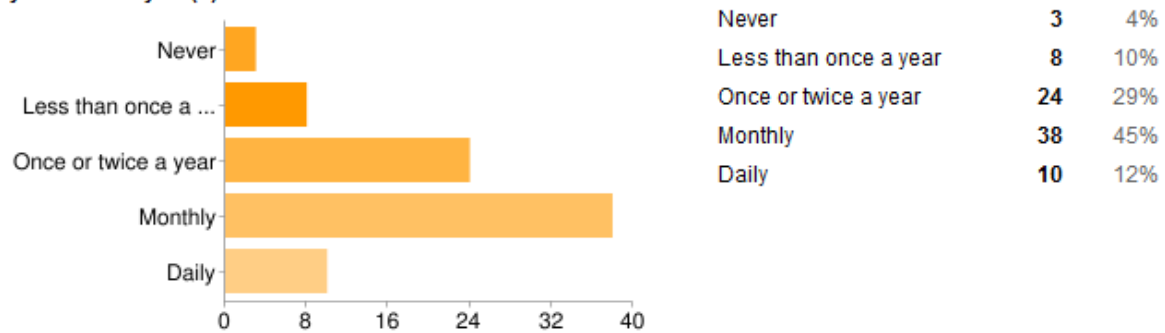

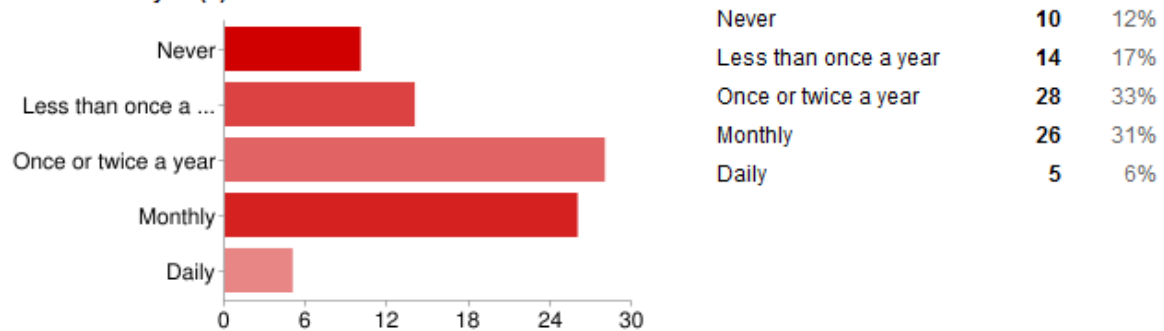
How often are you currently in contact with the following groups of people, in your life today? - LV Alumni from your ministry / community



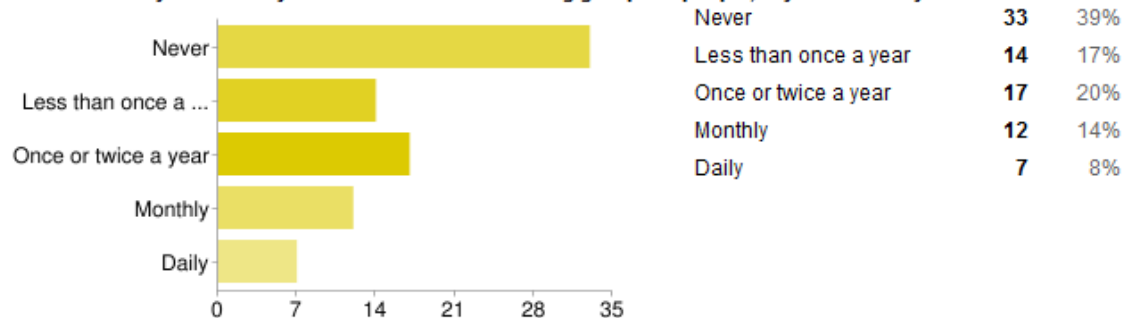
How often are you currently in contact with the following groups of people, in your life today? - LV Alumni from your service year(s)



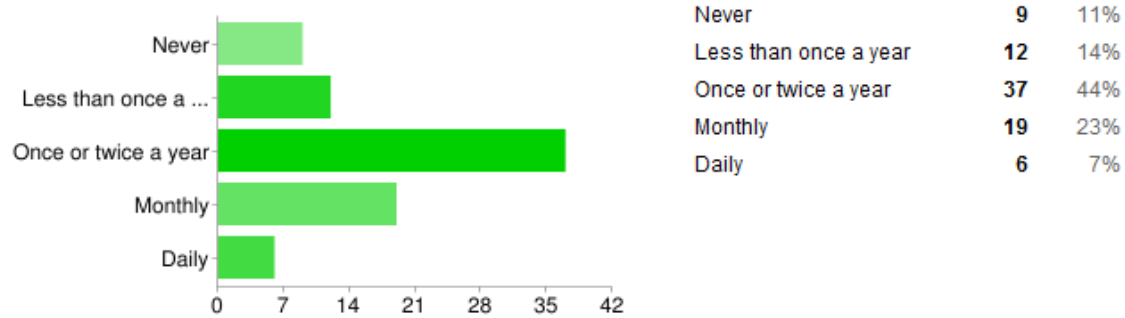
How often are you currently in contact with the following groups of people, in your life today? - LV Alumni from other service year(s)



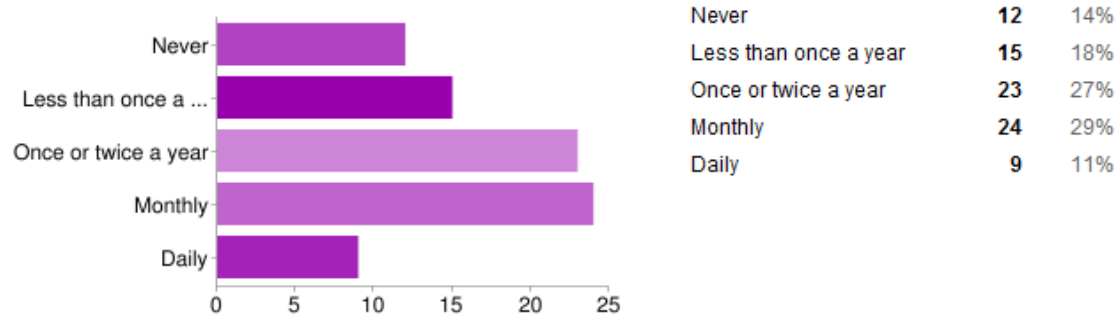
How often are you currently in contact with the following groups of people, in your life today? - Current LVs



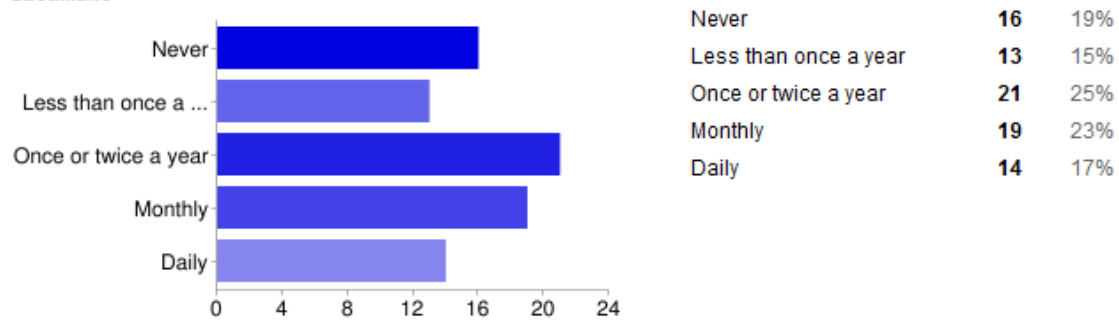
How often are you currently in contact with the following groups of people, in your life today? - Christian Brothers from your ministry / community



How often are you currently in contact with the following groups of people, in your life today? - Other Christian Brothers

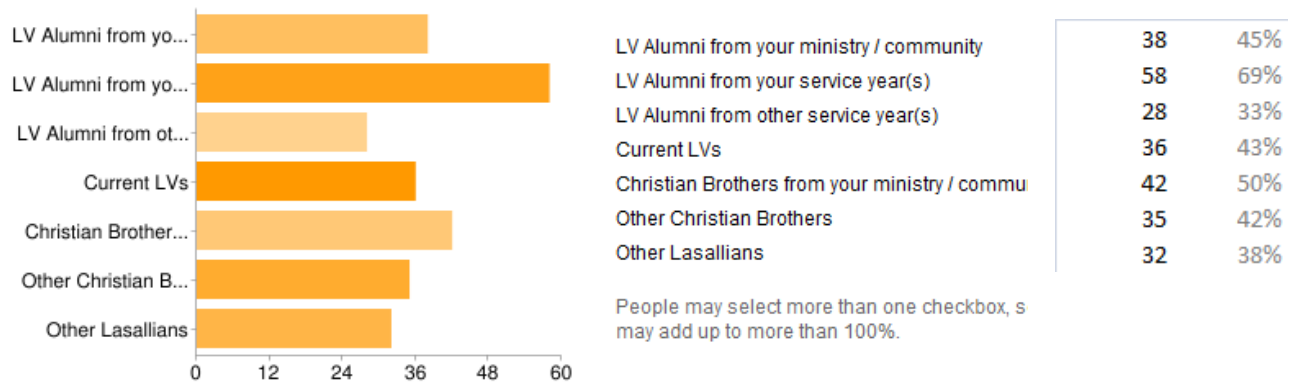


How often are you currently in contact with the following groups of people, in your life today? - Other Lasallians

Would you like to be in more frequent contact with any of the following groups of people connected to your LV €

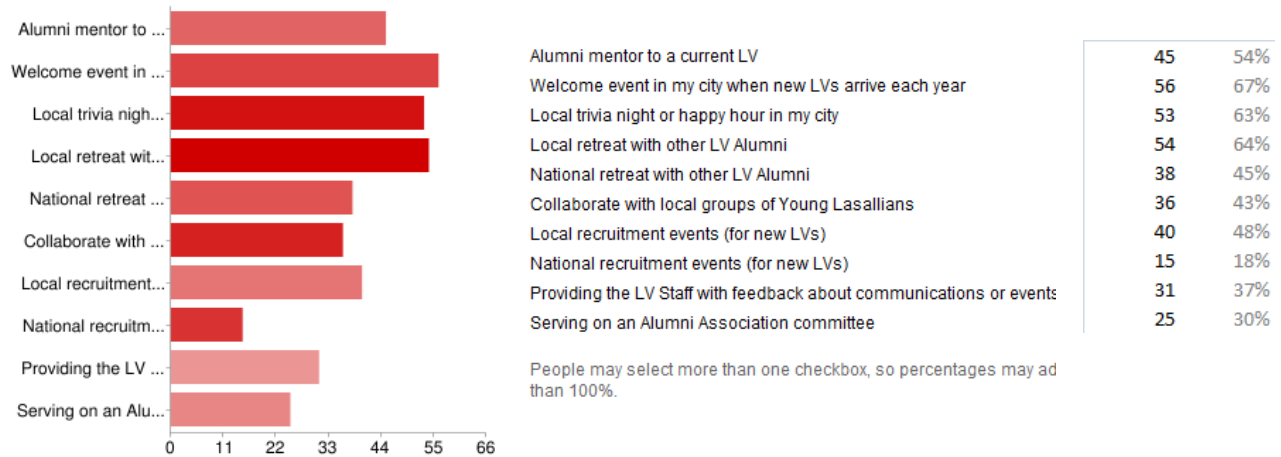

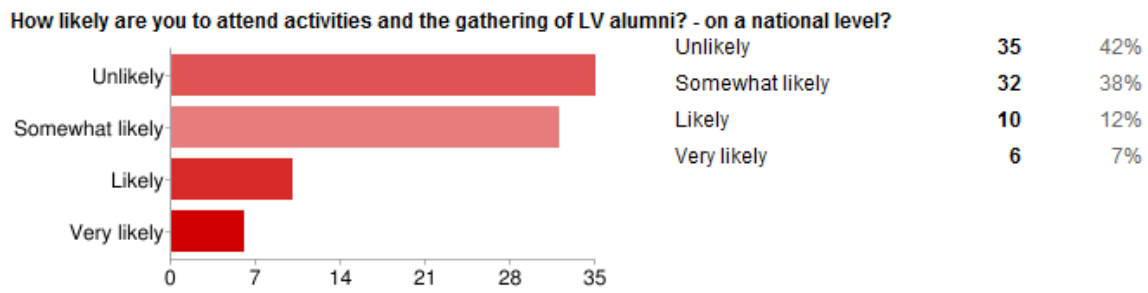
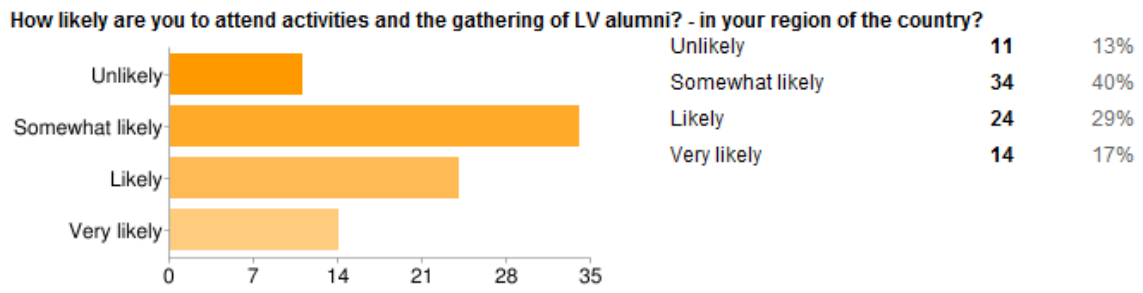
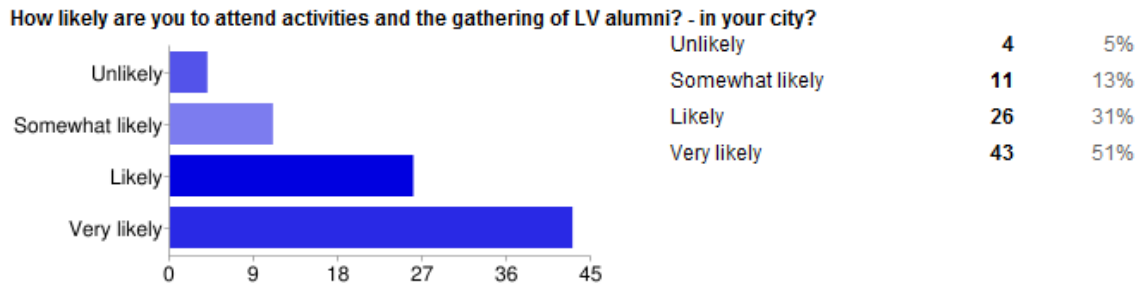


What other ideas or activities would like to see take place with the LV Alumni Association?

- A local AND national retreat for Alums is ESSENTIAL! We don't have the opportunity to stay as connected as we should be. Most of my connection with alums is through facebook..what a shame! I think we could really advance the mission and the beliefs by associating more often. It would also be great just to have a list of the alums in my area... Im not sure who they all are!
- An online community - for those of us who don't live near one of the big service cities it would be another way for us to connect.
- Bi-annual service days at local Lasallian ministry sites, both in terms of actively engaging in the ministry itself (tutoring/volunteer teaching/chaperoning) or supporting the ministry (painting/building maintenance/fundraiser). LV Alumni ought to be able to connect with Brothers and LVs in their area not only through fundraisers, but also through sharing in the work. Some type of continuing formation in Lasallian spirituality would also be nice, like a LLI or Buttimer but for alumni.
- Connect the LVAA to the LVAB as soon as possible.

Many of us would still love to serve - I think you would be surprised at the people who would turn up. And even if we cannot attend each event, I would definitely contribute goods or monetarily.
- Has the LV cookbook ever been created? I got emails about it multiple times in the past and submitted recipes but never saw anything about the actual book.

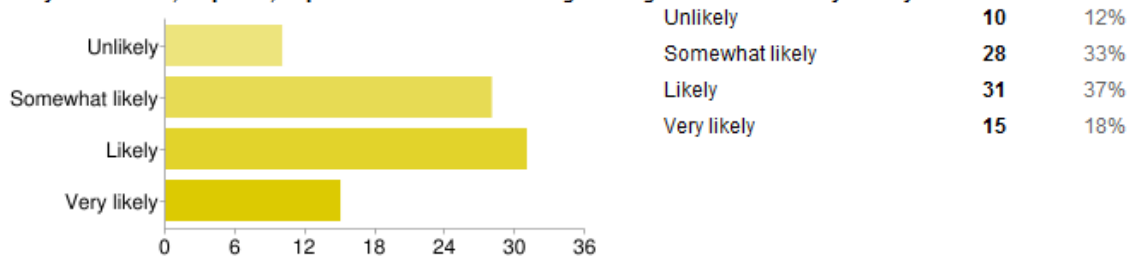
- i am not sure, but i live in DC and work next door to the Hecker center, so i am always happy to swing by and help out whenever needed.

The winner of the season gets to choose a charity to send a \$1500-\$2000 check provided by the league sponsor and I have made the Lasallian Volunteer program my charity of choice.

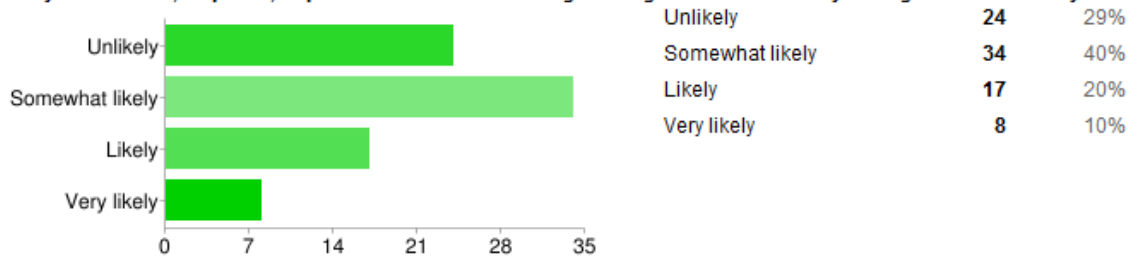

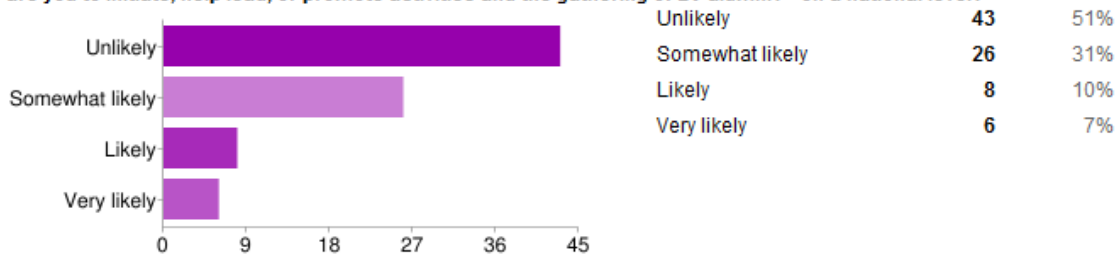

Interest in initiating, helping lead, or promoting local gatherings of LV alumni by District



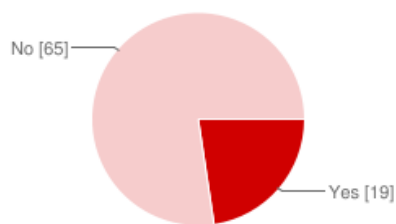

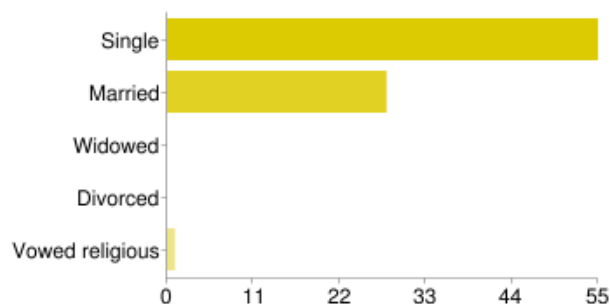

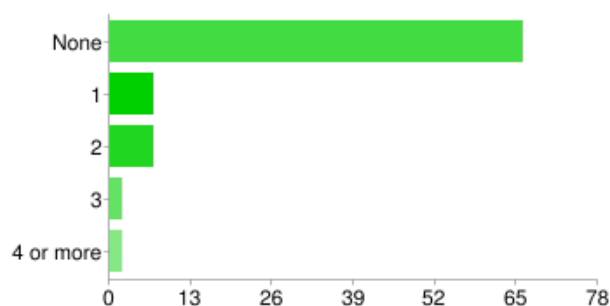

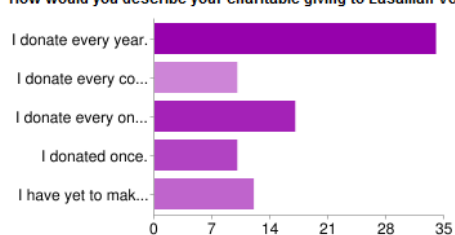
Do you have any children? If so, how many?

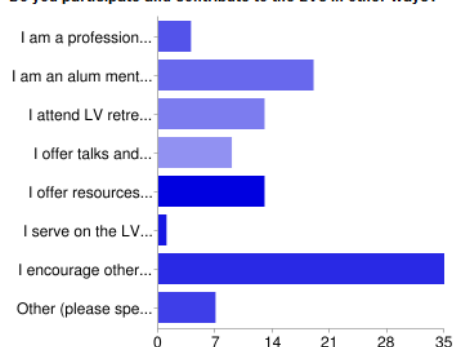
